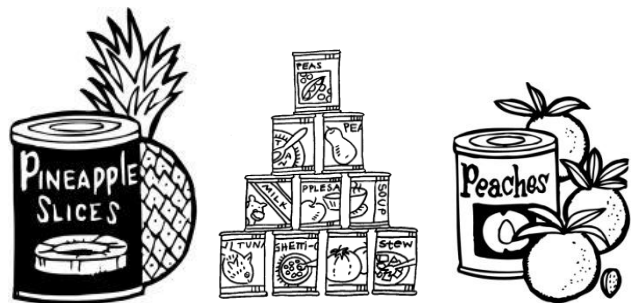

Because of This I Rejoice: A Lenten Quiet Day with Rev. Kate

Saturday, March 30th at St. Paul's
Sometimes Lent gets bad press. Lent is often viewed as a time of hard discipline, self-sacrifice, even gloominess, as we examine ourselves and concentrate on our human failings and mortality. Methodist Pastor Max O. Vincent's book, *Because of This I Rejoice*, proposes an alternative. Drawing on Paul's letter to the Philippians ("Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." *Philippians 4:4*) Vincent offers a series of meditations about joyfully practicing spiritual disciplines. On Saturday, March 30, Rev. Kate will lead a Lenten Quiet Day based on Vincent's book. The Day will begin at 9:00 AM in the Upper Parish Hall, and refreshments will be available from 8:30 AM. Lunch will be served and the Day will end at 4:00. You are welcome to stay on and attend the 4:30 service of Holy Eucharist. Donations of \$10 per person are appreciated but not required.
